
For the past 30 years, with your support, we have been able to help families — locally and globally — create the opportunity for a better life through affordable homeownership.

# **every team** impacts their community

Our Team Build program offers unique opportunities for corporations and community groups to share the experience of participating in a build. For the past four years, the nonprofit organization Trucks for Change has supported this program as part of its mandate to provide affordable and efficient ways for the Canadian transport logistics industry to make a positive difference in their communities.

In 2018, 35 transportation logistics industry employees volunteered 246 hours during three Team Build days and raised \$10,000 for Habitat Waterloo Region.

# **EVERY family** should have a home base from which they can explore the world

Jane and Dylan lived in a rental unit that had an unresolved mold problem. Their income went to pay student loans and basic expenses. With a new baby, this all meant there was little left over to save for a down payment on a house.

Habitat Waterloo Region offered Jane and Dylan a way to overcome their financial barriers to home ownership. Under our model, families provide a minimum of 500 hours of volunteer time, some of which is spent building their own home. "We weren't just given a home," recalls Jane. "The most important things in life are the things you need to work the hardest for. And we found that we needed to invest in our home to truly appreciate it."

When families partner with Habitat Waterloo Region, they start down a new path — one with far fewer barriers to a better, healthier, more financially stable life.






